PURPOSE OF PROGRAM

This is a career-oriented program and is not intended for transfer. It is designed for students who are seeking the development of entrepreneurial knowledge and skills, often with plans to open a new business. If a student wishes to earn a bachelor's degree in a business-related field, they should enroll in the Business Administration A.S. program.

PRIORITY COURSES

Priority courses for first semester if student is part-time or only able to take 12-13 credits:
BUAD103
CAPS121, CAPS131 and CAPS152
ENGL100

Students must complete MATH095 (if needed) in order to take ECON120 in the second semester.

COURSE SEQUENCING DETAILS

MATH095 (if needed) must be taken prior to, or concurrent with, ACCT101.
MATH095 (if needed) must be completed prior to ECON120.
BUAD103 and BUAD207 are only offered in the Fall.
BUAD108 and BUAD264 are only offered in the Spring.

GUIDELINES FOR CHOOSING COURSES

Even though many students will take MATH109 as their MATH elective, students are required to complete MATH095 (if needed) in order to take ACCT101 and ECON120.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES

Students will gain on-the-job experience through the required Entrepreneurial Internship, to be completed in the fourth semester. Students who successfully complete the program will have acquired entrepreneurial knowledge and skills necessary to start their own business, or to put these skills to work for other business owners.
