Job Responsibilities

General: Lifeguards must have positive leadership and communication skills, a good work ethic, a willingness to learn, and a friendly disposition. Applicants with strong swimming skills, customer service experience, the appropriate certification and training are preferred.

The Lifeguard's primary responsibilities are to provide patron surveillance of the pool area, enforce pool rules and regulations, and recognize and respond effectively to all emergencies.

Employment Period: Fall, Spring, and Summer Semester as registered

Pay Rate: \$8.25/hour

Specific:

- Administers first aid or CPR in an emergency and, if trained, using external defibrillator, if needed.
- Informs other lifeguards and facility staff when more help or equipment is needed.
- Completes required records and reports on schedule and submitting them to the Director of Recreation Sports.
- Maintains pool attendee information and records.
- Inspects the facility daily and reports any unsafe conditions or equipment to the Director of Recreation Sports.
- Performs maintenance or other tasks assigned by the Director of Recreation Sports
- Opens and closes the pool.
- Monitors and records pool chemistry.
- Provides daily participation counts and revenue reconciliation reports.
- Responsible for pool set up for scheduled events.
- Attends all meetings and in-service training.
- Understands facility characteristics, rules, policies, and procedures.
- Maintains and cleans equipment to meet safety and hygiene standards.

Requirements:

- Current certifications in Lifeguarding, First Aid and CPR for the Professional Rescuer and AED required.
- Knowledge of Recreation Sports employee manual.
- Ability to take charge of conflict resolution situations in a fair, timely and sensitive manner.
- Enforce rules and policies in a firm yet polite manner.

Reporting

Relationship: The Lifeguard reports to the Director of Recreation Sports.
